

**With grateful thanks to Mary Young for the following information and reminiscences:**

Mary lived in a cottage in The Chipping at Wotton-under-Edge as a child and has vivid memories of gatherings at the Tyndale Monument during the early 1920s.

*I can remember as a young child, from about 5 years old, joining in a walk through the woods from Wotton to the monument at North Nibley with lots of other people from the town. This happened every Good Friday. We would gather at the monument and have a lovely time meeting friends. In those days there were lots of seats around the Monument and the trees weren't as tall as now so we had a lovely view. Although it was Easter I don't think we had a church service there. One particular thing I remember was the man who owned the sweet shop in Market Street, bringing a trolley full of sweets to the monument on that day which he would sell.*
